1.BASIC INFORMATION ABOUT NOVI GRAD



Novi Grad is located in the northwest part of Bosnia and Herzegovina, along the beautiful banks of the Una and Sana rivers, beneath the slopes of the Kozara and Grmeč mountains. The city is well-connected to the CEFTA region, providing duty-free access to a multi-million market. It borders the Republic of Croatia, at the southeastern border of the European Union.

Although Novi Grad is relatively distant from the capital city of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Sarajevo (320 km), it is well-connected to central Bosnia and Herzegovina and its surroundings through a network of roads and railways. The closest major cities are Banja Luka (89 km) and the capital of the Republic of Croatia, Zagreb (135 km).

The distance between Novi Grad and the border with Slovenia is 140 km, with Austria is 246 km, and with Hungary is 220 km. Novi Grad is also well-connected by road and rail networks to the rest of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the northern part of the Republic of Croatia, as well as Central Dalmatia and ports on the Adriatic Sea.

The nearest international airports are located in Banja Luka (driving time: 1 hour), Zagreb (driving time: 2.5 hours), Split (driving time: 5 hours), Sarajevo (driving time: 5 hours), and Belgrade (driving time: 4 hours)..

2. TAXES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

Tax policy in Republic of Srpska is among the most stimulating in the region.

- \checkmark The personal **income tax** rate is 8%,
- ✓ The corporate income tax in the Republic of Srpska is calculated at a rate of 10%,
- ✓ The real estate tax Each local self-government unit determines the real estate tax rate on its territory and it can amount to a maximum of 0.20%. Exceptionally, the tax rate for real estate in which the production activity is directly performed is up to 0.10%.

The cumulative contribution rate in the **Republic of Srpska is 31% of gross salary,** of which: 18.5% is allocated for pension and disability insurance, 10.2% for health insurance, 1.7% for child protection and 0.6% for unemployment insurance.

The VAT rate of 17% is among the lowest in Europe.

Customs:

Customs regulations are implemented uniformly in BiH. The customs tariff contains a rate range of 0-15%. The Indirect Taxation Authority of BiH is responsible for collecting all customs duties. There are 4 main regional centers for customs clearance of goods in BiH: Customs Office Banja Luka, Customs Office Sarajevo, Customs Office Tuzla and Customs Office Mostar.

The signing of the Stabilisation and Association Agreement enabled the free export of almost all goods to the EU that meet the standards, and at the same time gradually opened the BiH market for EU goods according to the dynamics agreed in the annexes and protocols that are part of this Agreement.

Indirect taxes as well as customs policy are the responsibility of the joint institutions of BiH. More information is available on the website of the *Indirect Taxation Authority of BiH*.

5. NOTARY AND LAWYER SERVICES

The goals achieved by the notary public as part of the legal system of the Republic of Srpska are legal security, relief of the judiciary and public administration bodies, promptness and reliability of public registers. Notaries are given the exclusive competence to perform notarial processing of documents on legal transactions whose subject matter is the acquisition of property rights and other real rights to real estate, as well as the founding acts of companies. Also, notarised documents, which can also be executive documents, avoid disputes and skip possible long litigation procedures, and save participants in legal transactions time and money.

A wide range of legal services is available to domestic and foreign business entities, in all areas of business law (company law, banking law, taxes, labor relations, real estate, intellectual property...).

In accordance with the Law on Advocacy of the Republic of Srpska, the prices of legal services are determined by the Tariff on fees and costs reimbursement for lawyer's work in the Republic of Srpska (Official Gazette of the Republic of Srpska, 68/05).

Guarantees of the Guarantee fund of Republic of Srpska

<u>The Guarantee fund of Republic of Srpska</u> issues guarantees as security for a portion of the loans granted by banks to beneficiaries under guarantee lines, in case the beneficiaries under guarantee lines cannot provide adequate collateral for the loan required by the bank.

There are several types of guarantee lines, such as those for initial business activities, for companies, for entrepreneurs, for export support, for agriculture, etc.

The aim of organizing the Guarantee Program is to facilitate access to financial resources for micro, small, and mediumsized enterprises, as well as entrepreneurs, by issuing guarantees to secure claims on loans granted by financial institutions.

Factoring Law

The National Assembly of the Republic of Srpska adopted the Factoring Law at the end of 2020 ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 123/20). The purpose of enacting this law is to regulate factoring as a non-banking financial service to ensure greater access to financial resources for small and medium-sized enterprises through the purchase of overdue short-term monetary claims. The Factoring Law is intended to assist businesses that traditionally have difficulty accessing banking funds due to low creditworthiness or inadequate loan collateral.

Factoring is a legal transaction involving the purchase and sale of existing overdue or future short-term receivables arising from contracts for the sale of goods or the provision of services, involving the assignor, the factor, and the debtor. The subject of factoring may be the purchase of any existing overdue or future, whole or partial, short-term receivables arising from contracts for the sale of goods or the provision of services concluded between business entities. The recipient that acquires or purchases short-term receivables from the assignor (factor) can be a bank, a factoring company, or the Investment and Development Bank of the Republic of Srpska. 8. LABOR COSTS

Employment - Contracts and Conditions

Employment is established by an employment contract which regulates the rights, obligations, and responsibilities between employers and workers. General conditions for employment through the conclusion of an employment contract between an employer and a worker are regulated by the Labour Law ("Official Gazette of Republic of Srpska", No. 01/16 and 66/18, 91/21, 119/21, 112/23, 39/24). Specific conditions for employment are determined in relation to the specific job position and are regulated by a collective agreement and work rules. In addition to the general conditions set out by the law, conditions determined by a collective agreement and employer's regulations, a foreigner must also meet the specific requirement of having a work permit for concluding an employment contract issued by the Employment Bureau of Republic of Srpska.

The form and content of the employment contract are defined by Article 35 of the Labour Law and the <u>Regulation</u> on the Forms of Employment Contracts ("Official Gazette of Republic of Srpska", No. 9/22). More details on the legal regulations governing this area can be found on the website of the <u>Ministry of Labor</u>, <u>War Veterans and Disabled</u> <u>Persons' Protection</u>

In Republic of Srpska, the Labour Law regulates the negotiation of gross wages. In addition to the salary, an employee is entitled to meal allowance, transportation allowance for commuting to and from work, and the right to a holiday bonus. The minimum net wage in Republic of Srpska currently amounts to 460, 25 EUR, or in gross terms 687, 44 EUR. The meal allowance can be paid or provided through catering or in the employer's own canteen. If provided, the meal allowance is non-taxable up to the amount of 0,75% of the average net wage, which in 2024 amounts to 4, 86 EUR per day. The meal allowance paid out cannot be less than 0, 85% of the average gross wage, which in 2024 amounts to 8,42 EUR per day. The meal allowance paid out is not exempt from contribution and tax calculations.

An employee is entitled to a holiday bonus for using annual leave. The amount of the holiday bonus is not prescribed by law but is determined by the employer's decision.

The allowance for commuting to and from work is exempt from contributions and taxes up to the amount of the public transport ticket price.

The employer is obliged to increase the basic salary by 0,3% for each year of service.

The salary for work increased for length of service + meal allowance in cash + holiday bonus represents the total gross income of the worker on which taxes and contributions are calculated.

Contributions are calculated at a rate of 31% on the gross salary. Tax is calculated at a rate of 8% on the base consisting of the gross salary reduced by personal deduction, which currently amounts to 512,82 EUR, and deductions based on the tax card that each worker can obtain from the Tax Administration for dependent family members, housing loans, or additional insurance.

For example: If the employer wants to pay the minimum wage and a meal allowance in accordance with the law, the minimum gross salary with an allowance for a worker with no length of service is 881,04 EUR, i.e., net 578,34EUR + tax and contributions 302,70 EUR.

Contributions

The system of mandatory contributions for financing pension and disability insurance, health insurance, unemployment insurance, and child protection in Republic of Srpska is regulated by the <u>Contributions Law ("Official</u> Gazette of Republika Srpska" No. 114/17, 112/19, 49/21, 119/21, 56/22, 132/22, 112/23, 110/24), and the contributor of contributions under this law is the income payer (recipient) representing the basis for payment of contributions in accordance with this law.

Funds for financing pension and disability insurance, health insurance, unemployment insurance, and child protection are provided through contributions:

- Contribution for pension and disability insurance 18.5% of gross salary,
- Contribution for health insurance 10.2% of gross salary,
- Contribution for unemployment insurance 0.6% of gross salary,
- Contribution for child protection 1.7% of gross salary.

The contribution for the rehabilitation, training, and employment of persons with disabilities is regulated by the <u>Law on Professional Rehabilitation</u>, <u>Training</u>, and <u>Employment of Persons with Disabilities</u>. Every employer who does not employ at least one person with a disability out of sixteen (16) employees is obliged to pay a contribution for the rehabilitation, training, and employment of persons with disabilities in the amount of 0,1% of each paid gross income. This obligation also applies to employers who employ fewer than 16 workers.



9. INVESTOR PROTECTION

The Law on Foreign Investments in the Republic of Srpska (Official Gazette of the Republic of Srpska, No. 21/18) is one of the most liberal ones and ensures that:

- A foreign investor has the same rights and obligations as domestic investors,
- A foreign investor may establish a business entity under the same conditions that apply to domestic investors. The only restriction exists for the military industry sector (production of weapons, ammunition, explosives for military use) and media affairs. However, in these sectors, investment is possible up to 49% of the capital value, and above it, with the consent of the Government of Republic of Srpska. Investment in all other sectors is free,
- A foreign investor can acquire ownership of real estate in accordance with the regulations on real rights (i.e. on the basis of reciprocity),
- Foreign investment is exempt from customs duties and obligations in accordance with the provisions of the law governing customs policy in BiH,
- A foreign investor has the right to open an account for the purpose of investing in the territory of the Republic of Srpska, in any commercial bank, in domestic or any other free convertible currency,
- A foreign investor has the right to employ workers from abroad without restrictions, unless otherwise determined by special regulations governing the areas of work and employment of foreign persons, if there are no such workers on the domestic labor market,
- It is guaranteed to the foreign investor that his investments will not be expropriated or subject to measures with similar consequences, except in exceptional cases, when it is in the public interest and in accordance with laws and other regulations, which also apply to domestic investment.,

• A foreign investor has the right to transfer funds arising as a result of his investment in the Republic of Srpska, without restrictions, in any free convertible currency with prior settlement of all tax and other legally prescribed obligations based on public revenues in the Republic of Srpska,

Investment protection agreements

BiH has signed agreements on investment promotion and protection with the following countries: Albania, Austria, Belgium and Luxembourg, Belarus, Montenegro, Czech Republic, Denmark, Egypt, Finland, France, Greece, Netherlands, Croatia, India, Iran, Italy, Canada, Qatar, China, Kuwait, Lithuania, Hungary, Macedonia, Malaysia, Moldova, Germany, Pakistan, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Slovakia, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Switzerland, Sweden, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, Jordan and OPEC countries.

Risk protection

Foreign investors concerned about restrictions on profit transfer, expropriation, war and civil unrest, and denial of justice can insure themselves against these risks with the <u>Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency</u> (MIGA, part of the World Bank Group).



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
